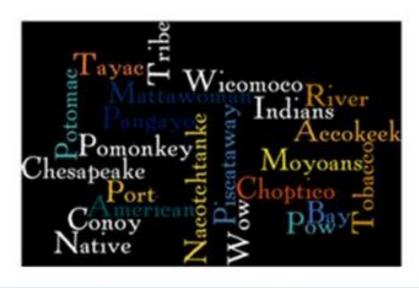

Collaborative and Shared Leadership

New Mexico Story

- Design Process with school leaders to determine opportunities, needs and challenges related to community school development (9 one-hour sessions)
- Collected and analyzed qualitative and quantitative evidence from sessions
- Built two 8-week Micro-credential experiences
- Improvement Science model with coaches, cohorts and tools to support leaders



SUSTAINABLE COLLABORATIVE LEADERSHIP

People

intentional relationship building that cultivates trust among all parties



A Collaborative Leadership Environment

Culture

building a culture of ownership and shared power among all parties

Process

collaborating to build systems and structures for shared leadership that endure staff and leadership changes





Key Principles & Ideas

- Collaborative leadership is about Power shifting and sharing...
- Leader is about role, leadership is about action
- Building and learning from the ground up
- Collaborative Leadership is about the whole person; intellectual, social, emotional, ethical...
- Transformation of individuals and organizations

Principals can't do this alone, what does this mean for the systems upstream (district, state, federal)?


What does accountability look like in a shared and collaborative culture? Or do we need to shift from an accountability system seeking blame to a more positive system that is solution oriented?

How Principals at FSCSs "Perform" Cross-Boundary Collaborative Leadership

Cross-Boundary Collaborative Leadership

Direct engagement with stakeholders

Facilitation of stakeholder interaction to promote communication and collaborative practice

Purposive selection of and professional development for faculty and staff to ensure that they had the capacity to build positive relationships


Not Just Principals: Understanding Collaborative Leadership from a Systems Perspective
